CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAM AT MAIN CAMPUS:

CE-PS 37: ORGANIZING EFFECTIVE YOUTH MINISTRY

How can we structure and design our parish youth ministry efforts for effectiveness and longevity? This question will be our guide as we explore many of the critical leadership skills and tasks necessary for organizing youth ministry. We will examine a variety of program models, learn effective planning skills, and discuss methods of inviting, training, and supporting leaders.

CE-SS 12: THE GOSPELS

This course will introduce the student to the four canonical gospels. CE-SY 04: FOUNDATIONS IN THEOLOGY

This is a foundational course for all subsequent courses in systematic theology. The starting point will be "faith seeking understanding" within the tradition of the Church. Basic concepts and background for all theology will be studied. The course will explore human and religious experience, revelation, faith, tradition, biblical authority, the magisterium (infallibility) and the development of doctrine.

CE-SS 05: PAULINE LITERATURE

This course will introduce the student to the writings associated with St. Paul, writings that changed the known world and became the foundation of the church's theology and spirituality. After situating Paul within the context of his own historical time and circumstances, we will explore the Pauline worldview and some of the major themes and teachings that remain relevant for the individual, the Church and contemporary society.

CE-SY 30: METAPHYSICS

Metaphysics is a branch of philosophy that is important for the study of theology. Topics include free will, personal identity, realism and idealism, possibility and necessity, cosmology, causation, and time.

A comprehensive study of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults will include knowledge of the Catechumenate process, class interaction, modeling
