**Article in a Reference Book**

Section 17.238 of the Chicago Manual of Style (15<sup>th</sup> ed.) says, “Well-known reference books, such as major dictionaries and encyclopedias, are normally cited in notes rather than in bibliographies.”

If citation in a bibliography is necessary, cite as you would a contribution to a multi-author book.

## **Bible**

Section 17.247 of the Chicago Manual of Style (15<sup>th</sup> ed) states, “References to the Jewish or Christian scriptures usually appear in text citations or notes rather than in bibliographies.”

\* A multivolume set is a work published in more than one physical volume and not open-ended in nature. In other words, there is a finite amount of information and a planned end to the publication. By contrast, a monographic series is open-ended with no foreseeable end.
